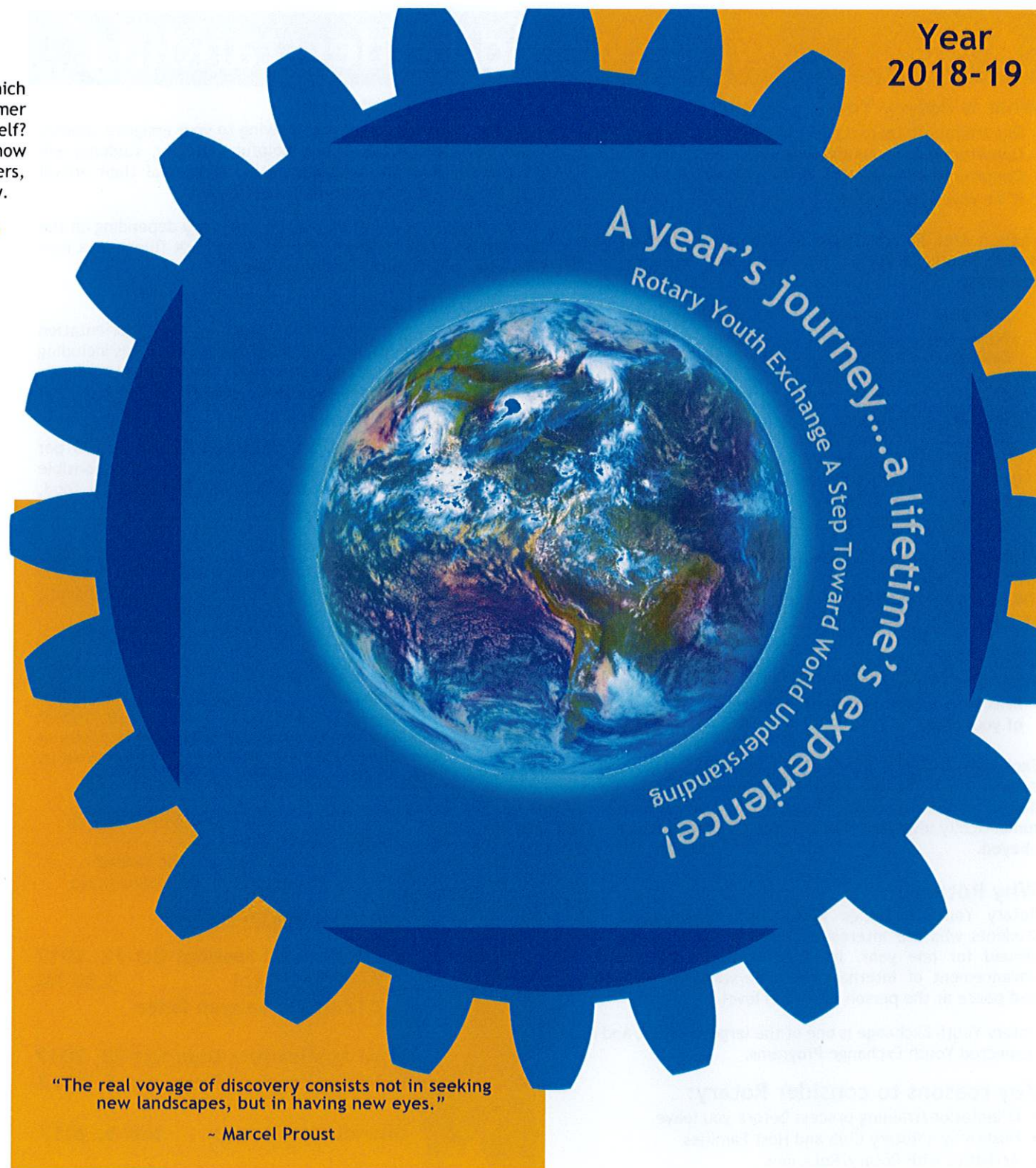

When applying, indicate which countries interest you and we attempt to place you in one of them. Unfortunately, due to the nature of our program we cannot guarantee that you will be placed in a specific country.

Eligibility

- Between 16 and 18.5 years old at the time of departure
- Must have a GPA of at least 2.75 or be in the top 50% of your class

Exchange students must agree while in their host country they will not drive a motorized vehicle, use drugs, drink alcoholic beverages, or become romantically involved. Laws of the country must be obeyed.

Why Rotary?

Rotary Youth Exchange is for high school aged students who are interested in living and studying abroad for one year. Its goal is to promote the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace at the person to person level.

Rotary Youth Exchange is one of the largest, oldest and most respected Youth Exchange Programs.

Key reasons to consider Rotary:

- Orientation/training process before you leave
- Hosted by a Rotary Club and Host Families
- Activities with Rotary/Rotarians

Learning the Language

Learning the language prior to leaving to your assigned country is not required, but it is very helpful. Usually, students will adequately learn the language within months of their arrival with the help of their host family and friends.

Some language preparation may be necessary depending on the country you visit. Many students come back fluent in a new language, which can be a lifelong benefit.

Parents' Obligations

A fee of approximately \$7,000 covers airfare, 4 orientation meetings, medical insurance, administrative expenses including visas and language camps (if required). During your student's year abroad, you should experience savings due to food, car insurance, etc...

Rotary host clubs provide a minimum allowance of \$75 per month for the student to cover incidentals, and is responsible for arranging suitable host families who will provide food, lodging, schooling, and supervision.
