



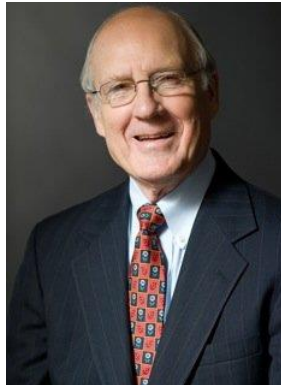

May 16 at Park Hotel: Dave Baskerville on Stretch Targets for Wisconsin: An Update

Next Wednesday, May 16, at the Park Hotel, guest speaker and fellow Rotarian **Dave Baskerville** will update Rotarians and guests on what he describes as “a grassroots, bi-partisan, very practical, realistic and accountable endeavor/attempt to turn our State around economically and educationally.” Dave says, “We should EXPECT MUCH MORE in our great State in terms of real incomes and social mobility!” He will articulate the two targets, that long term, he hopes can positively impact the quality of our Wisconsin life.

Dave is a native of Madison and graduate of West High School. He did his undergraduate work at Princeton and Iowa and has Masters degrees from the Lutheran School of Theology-Chicago, University of Michigan and Harvard University. He is also a graduate of the Tokyo School of Japanese Language.

After serving eight years as a Lutheran industrial missionary in Japan, he worked for two companies as a senior executive: Weyerhaeuser Company and Siecor Corporation. He retired from Siecor in 1993, returned to Madison, where he established Baskerville International Ltd., a one person office that consults/counsels executives on general strategy

and international business.

Dave now spends considerable time on StretchTargets.org, an attempt to engage Wisconsin citizens in long-term direction and accountability.
