Prof. Marah Curtis

Addressing Homelessness--Nationally & Statewide: What Do We Know?

Next Wednesday, May 15, at the Park Hotel, guest speaker **UW Professor Marah Curtis** will briefly summarize what evidence we have about the causes of homelessness; the latest Housing and Urban Development Study on service delivery outcomes for homeless families; and state and national strategies to address homelessness and the broader issue of

housing insecurity.

Dr. Curtis was trained in social policy, planning and policy analysis at Columbia University School of Social Work and began her academic career at Boston University. Her research focuses on how differences in housing conditions, benefit policies and contextual factors affect the health and well being of families.

Since 2012 she has been on the faculty in the School of Social Work at UW-Madison, where she is an Associate Professor and teaches courses on social policy and poverty.
